

Hi Paige -

On your first question, yes – the \$171 you see on the slide includes the Y/Health & Wellness facility - \$94.25 and \$77 is related to Student Health, Counseling & Testing, Prevention Services, Sports Clubs, and Heskett center. On your handout from Monday, the latter costs are part of the Student Services Fee (total \$393.41). The numbers in the graph from WSU are quoted based on the headcount model, tier 1 full-time student charges.

Currently, students pay by credit hour for Student Health, Counseling & Testing, Prevention Services, Sports Clubs, and Heskett center. The credit hour charge for those portions of the Student Services budget in the current year is \$6.27 per credit hour or \$94.05 for a 15 hour student. So, going to the headcount model decreases this to \$77.

On the last question, I can assure you that waivers for students aren't going away because of the innovation campus. IF there has been a change on fee waivers, it is not connected to Innovation. I'm going to follow-up with some of my colleagues to see if there has been a change, and will get back with you.





Paige,

I'm looping in Jillian Hoefer, Director of CDC as well. The drop in childcare that is being proposed with the Y would be for several hours at a time and would not be full day childcare. The CDC's children come daily and have a comprehensive educational program based on their developmental needs. While drop in childcare will be developmentally appropriate, it will not necessarily be educationally focused in nature. The licenses required for full time daycare and drop in or part time child care are different. The drop in childcare would not provide meals and would be used as a solution for need to have a child watched in instances such as for taking a test, going to class when one's regular childcare provider was not available, attending a career fair, working out in the facility, going to a counseling appointment... It would not be a substitute for regular childcare. How fees would work would need to be determined with the Y. Options to be discussed and determined could be a pay as you go fee, purchasing a "punch card"... This is also different from the drop in childcare provided at other Y's where parents can drop off children for short periods of time while they work out in the facility. The type of license required to have parents leave the facility is different.

Hello At-Large Senators!

My name is Taben Azad and am a student at Wichita State. I am emailing you all in regards to tonights vote for the YMCA proposal. I unfortunately do not support the YMCA and wellness fee as a whole. Attached below are a few items that I would like for you to consider when voting tonight. As a constituent, it isn't my job to tell you how to vote, but to ask that you consider my opinion when casting your vote.

University of Washington Tacoma:

- 1. Students supported a \$180 fee for the creation of a University Y AND a Student Center to house their Student Involvement, Student Activities Board, and their SGA. This is all housed under the single constructed building. The narrative has been that the students supported just the YMCA, but actually it was their version of a YMCA and their version of an RSC.
- 2. Tacoma's student population of 4,987 also supported the YMCA component because they did not have a full operating campus recreation facility (unlike WSU's Heskett Center).
- 3. This proposal began in 2008 and took years of student engagement and discussion till it's opening in 2015. Wichita State is asking students to consider this proposal in the matter of weeks.

Recent SGA Statement:

The recent press release from SGA ignores the following:

- 1. No jobs lost: This comes AFTER the fact that Eric Maki was removed from the University. Let's stop using the University's "resignation" as the verbiage and call it what it is as we all know that the "direction of the University" is forcing out true student advocates such Eric out of campus when they speak the truth.
- 2. Services that the Heskett provide will no longer be necessary which ultimately means that

there will be a reduction in jobs inevitably in addition to a decrease in operating hours for the Heskett (being open in the morning, close in the afternoon, and then opening back up in the evening).

3. There were more concerns about prefacing Innovation Campus over Main Campus and not giving more priority to aging buildings on campus (Fine Arts, Health Professions, and etc). When will this be addressed?

Student Fee Breakdown:

This is the most important part. How the student fees are not going to the operating costs, but is profit for the YMCA itself:

- 1. The total amount of money that student fees is being gathered for is \$2.325 million per year.
- 2. The operating cost for a 45,000 square foot facility is around \$300,000 per year.
- 3. That means that nearly 13% of your student fee for the YMCA is actually going to operating expenditures, the other 87% of this is profit for the YMCA. For 50 years, out of the \$116.25 million in student fees generated, nearly \$100 million is profit for the YMCA. Essentially, we're paying the YMCA \$2 million a year.
- 4. This student fee doesn't cover the additional expense to use childcare services at the YMCA.
- 5. Keep in mind that Dr. Hall wishes to see SGA have less of an influence on student fee's coming into this next year so that students have less power on controlling the fees that they pay themselves. This will be important to know moving into the summer when her, Provost Vizzini, and Wichita State University President John Bardo consider changes to SGA.

Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR):

It was stated on March 8th, 2017 that without Senate support, the University would not be moving forward with a YMCA or Wellness Center. Dr. Tomblin stated:

"If you do not want it, then I'll mark it off the master plan and we will move on, so absolutely, if you do not want it, then I say we move on."

Dr. Hall a week later, after realizing that students were not in favor of this proposal, quoted the following: "The SGA vote..is more of a recommendation to university president John Bardo than a mandate. The president assembles the annual budget, including proposed fees." What students don't realize is that although Student Government Association of Wichita State is not a mandate, it will hold a substantial influence at the upcoming KBOR meeting in a few weeks which will ultimately approve or deny the University's request to garner student fees for this building. The Regents will ask President Bardo on whether or not students have been involved in the process, which is why SGA has been used as a checkmark by the PET so many times in years past.

If Dr. Hall is devaluing SGA power, why is this being brought up again if an SGA vote holds no weight? If Dr. Tomblin truly meant what he said back in March, why wait until the 59th Session was out and there was a new administration in support of the proposal? 



Paige,

I'm looping in Jillian Hoefer, Director of CDC as well. The drop in childcare that is being proposed with the Y would be for several hours at a time and would not be full day childcare. The CDC's children come daily and have a comprehensive educational program based on their developmental needs. While drop in childcare will be developmentally appropriate, it will not necessarily be educationally focused in nature. The licenses required for full time daycare and drop in or part time child care are different. The drop in childcare would not provide meals and would be used as a solution for need to have a child watched in instances such as for taking a test, going to class when one's regular childcare provider was not available, attending a career fair, working out in the facility, going to a counseling appointment... It would not be a substitute for regular childcare. How fees would work would need to be determined with the Y. Options to be discussed and determined could be a pay as you go fee, purchasing a "punch card"... This is also different from the drop in childcare provided at other Y's where parents can drop off children for short periods of time while they work out in the facility. The type of license required to have parents leave the facility is different.

I'm looping in Jillian Hoefer, Director of CDC as well. The drop in childcare that is being proposed with the Y would be for several hours at a time and would not be full day childcare. The CDC's children come daily and have a comprehensive educational program based on their developmental needs. While drop in childcare will be developmentally appropriate, it will not necessarily be educationally focused in nature. The licenses required for full time daycare and drop in or part time child care are different. The drop in childcare would not provide meals and would be used as a solution for need to have a child watched in instances such as for taking a test, going to class when one's regular childcare provider was not available, attending a career fair, working out in the facility, going to a counseling appointment... It would not be a substitute for regular childcare. How fees would work would need to be determined with the Y. Options to be discussed and determined could be a pay as you go fee, purchasing a "punch card"... This is also different from the drop in childcare provided at other Y's where parents can drop off children for short periods of time while they work out in the facility. The type of license required to have parents leave the facility is different.

Hello At-Large Senators!

My name is Taben Azad and am a student at Wichita State. I am emailing you all in regards to tonights vote for the YMCA proposal. I unfortunately do not support the YMCA and wellness fee as a whole. Attached below are a few items that I would like for you to consider when voting tonight. As a constituent, it isn't my job to tell you how to vote, but to ask that you consider my opinion when casting your vote.

University of Washington Tacoma:

- 1. Students supported a \$180 fee for the creation of a University Y AND a Student Center to house their Student Involvement, Student Activities Board, and their SGA. This is all housed under the single constructed building. The narrative has been that the students supported just the YMCA, but actually it was their version of a YMCA and their version of an RSC.
- 2. Tacoma's student population of 4,987 also supported the YMCA component because they did not have a full operating campus recreation facility (unlike WSU's Heskett Center).
- 3. This proposal began in 2008 and took years of student engagement and discussion till it's opening in 2015. Wichita State is asking students to consider this proposal in the matter of weeks.

Recent SGA Statement:

The recent press release from SGA ignores the following:

- 1. No jobs lost: This comes AFTER the fact that Eric Maki was removed from the University. Let's stop using the University's "resignation" as the verbiage and call it what it is as we all know that the "direction of the University" is forcing out true student advocates such Eric out of campus when they speak the truth.
- 2. Services that the Heskett provide will no longer be necessary which ultimately means that there will be a reduction in jobs inevitably in addition to a decrease in operating hours for the Heskett (being open in the morning, close in the afternoon, and then opening back up in the evening).
- 3. There were more concerns about prefacing Innovation Campus over Main Campus and not giving more priority to aging buildings on campus (Fine Arts, Health Professions, and etc). When will this be addressed?

Student Fee Breakdown:

This is the most important part. How the student fees are not going to the operating costs, but is profit for the YMCA itself:

- 1. The total amount of money that student fees is being gathered for is \$2.325 million per year.
- 2. The operating cost for a 45,000 square foot facility is around \$300,000 per year.
- 3. That means that nearly 13% of your student fee for the YMCA is actually going to operating expenditures, the other 87% of this is profit for the YMCA. For 50 years, out of the \$116.25 million in student fees generated, nearly \$100 million is profit for the YMCA. Essentially, we're paying the YMCA \$2 million a year.
- 4. This student fee doesn't cover the additional expense to use childcare services at the YMCA.
- 5. Keep in mind that Dr. Hall wishes to see SGA have less of an influence on student fee's coming into this next year so that students have less power on controlling the fees that they pay themselves. This will be important to know moving into the summer when her, Provost Vizzini, and Wichita State University President John Bardo consider changes to SGA.

Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR):

It was stated on March 8th, 2017 that without Senate support, the University would not be moving forward with a YMCA or Wellness Center. Dr. Tomblin stated:

"If you do not want it, then I'll mark it off the master plan and we will move on, so absolutely, if you do not want it, then I say we move on."

Dr. Hall a week later, after realizing that students were not in favor of this proposal, quoted the following: "The SGA vote..is more of a recommendation to university president John Bardo than a mandate. The president assembles the annual budget, including proposed fees." What students don't realize is that although Student Government Association of Wichita State is not a mandate, it will hold a substantial influence at the upcoming KBOR meeting in a few weeks which will ultimately approve or deny the University's request to garner student fees for this building. The Regents will ask President Bardo on whether or not students have been involved in the process, which is why SGA has been used as a checkmark by the PET so many times in years past.

If Dr. Hall is devaluing SGA power, why is this being brought up again if an SGA vote holds

no weight? If Dr. Tomblin truly meant what he said back in March, why wait until the 59th Session was out and there was a new administration in support of the proposal? Please feel free to email me with any questions that you might have. Thank you again for your service to the Association!
